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The idea of this project is described in this paper accepted and supported by all participants of the European Bibliodrama Network Meeting, London 2011.

Common Bibliodrama Training around the Baltic Sea

The team of the Mecklenburg (North-Germany) Bibliodrama Education courses has the idea to bring the BD-education on a European level. We have discussed this plan with our colleagues in Lidingö (S) and want to involve you in our process.

The Steps:

1. We prepare a letter to the authorities of the North-European Churches and to the Bibliodramatists we know there asking for interest and support.
2. We publish this letter in London, September this year, asking for support by the EBN and send it to the Baltic Sea Countries.
3. We consult the Grundtvig National Agency how to apply.
4. We invite interested persons from educational institutions or churches to a preparation meeting including the European BD-Congress in Hannover August 21st – 26th, 2012.
5. There we work on the application for support by the Grundtvig-Programme and the churches for Sept. 2013 – August 2015.

Why the Baltic Sea Area?

As the idea comes from North-Germany, we suppose that these churches are interested in such a new network. >But it seems to be a good idea to meet Italians and other too.<

Peter Varga has the idea to form another group (Vishegrad 4 = Check, Slovakia, Hungarian, Romania).

A lot of questions are hidden in this item. For that reason we involve other countries into the discussion.

Description

The German Bibliodrama Society (GfB) plans in cooperation with the European Bibliodrama Network (EBN) a bibliodrama education course for participants from Baltic Sea countries. This Course has two parts:

The Basic-Course trains Bibliodrama-leaders especially for multicultural groups according to the guidelines of the EBN. The focus is to qualify for working with multicultural and multilingual groups (270 lessons in 6 units.)

The advanced course (Lehrbibliodrama-Leiter-Kurs) enables Bibliodrama-Leaders or practicing Bibliodramatists to educate Bibliodrama leaders in courses and to coach them. The basic-course will be their field of training and reflection.



To achieve this aims, the participants and the trainers of this courses should be mixed from different languages and cultures. The courses are to take place in different countries.

Aims of this Education:

1. Teachers in adult education learn approaches and ways to work with multicultural and multilingual groups (improving skills and competences).
2. The range of bibliodramatical methods for multicultural etc, groups will be improved and published for the following work on European level (developing of methods).
3. The framework of this course encourages participants to socialise with each other and thus enables them to initiate transnational education courses and meetings (networking).
4. The courses give participants from countries without Bibliodrama-education a chance, to get such a qualification for Bibliodrama-leader or Bibliodrama-coach. This is the precondition to implement Bibliodrama in these Countries. (Implementing new approaches).
