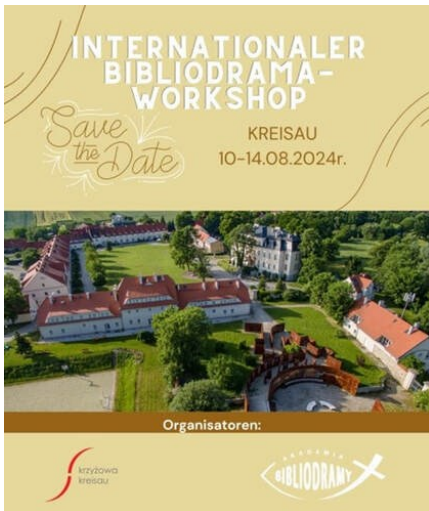

The next annual workshop will be in Kreisau, Poland, from the 10th to the 14th of August 2024.

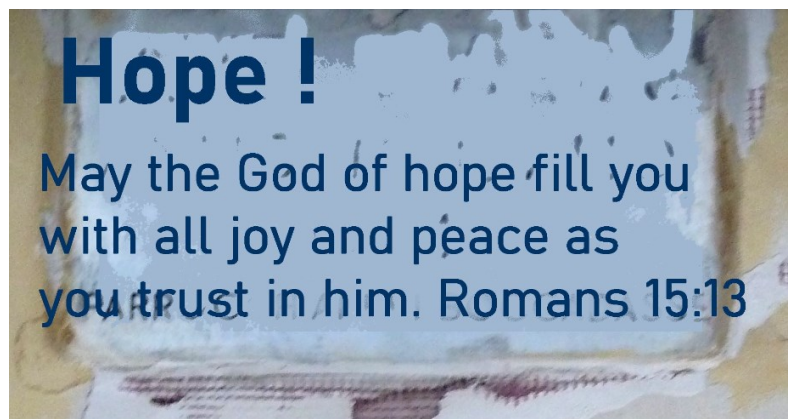
